



Coronavirus: Remote Learning Plan and Offer for Tiered Local Restrictions / Lockdown

Here is what the 4 'tiers of restriction' / Lockdown will mean for our school and the actions we will take for each one.

Tier 1,2 and 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We'll remain open for all pupils. • Visitors will be asked to wear face coverings when moving around communal areas in school where it's difficult to maintain social distancing, unless they're exempt from wearing one. • Children self-isolating 	<p>All visitors to be given a list of expectations before arriving at the school. Visit only by appointment.</p> <p>Disposable masks to be kept in school in case visitors arrive without these.</p> <p>Home Learning will be provided for the core subjects through Teams and any online subscriptions such as: Bug Club, Times Table Rockstars, Spelling Shed, Accelerated Reader, Nessy and relevant links published on our website.</p> <p>Safeguarding DSL / DDSL will contact parents of vulnerable children weekly</p>

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff self- isolating 	<p>Class teacher will maintain weekly contact with all children through Teams and Dojo and there will be an expectation that work is sent in daily if children are well enough</p> <p>If staff member is well enough, they will deliver lessons through Teams – this will be balanced with recorded lessons.</p> <p>If they are not well enough, the school will endeavor to have another adult deliver lessons or bring in a supply teacher.</p> <p>Safeguarding / Wellbeing</p> <p>HT will maintain weekly contact with staff members</p> <p>If HT unavailable SLT will maintain contact</p>
Tier 4 / Lockdown	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We will only remain open for vulnerable pupils and the children of critical workers 	<p>Remote Learning / Curriculum</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We will continue to endeavour to deliver as broad and balanced a curriculum as possible whilst working in the confines of remote teaching • Online inputs may be reduced dependent on staffing needed in school and staff illness – parents will be signposted to further resources e.g. Oak National Academy and BBC Bitesize • Teachers will deliver a mix of live and recorded inputs daily through Teams • Inputs will be as follows and will generally last up to 20mins and some of the subjects will be adapted for EYFS: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Live register, daily timetable and catchup in the morning ➤ Maths – recorded x 3 weekly, short mental starter (live) x 1-3 weekly ➤ Guided Reading – recorded x 3 weekly ➤ Writing – recorded x 3 weekly

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Spelling / Phonics – recorded x 2 weekly ➤ Grammar (Year 2 – 6) – recorded x 2 weekly ➤ Science – live /recorded x 1 weekly ➤ History or Geography – live / recorded x 1 weekly ➤ PSHE – live x 1 weekly ➤ R.E. recorded x 1 weekly ➤ Children will be expected to read daily and encouraged to take part in some form of physical fitness e.g. Joe Wicks, walking, Go Noodle, Cosmic Yoga and weekly art / DT challenges set as a whole school ➤ Arrangements for packs to be provided for those children who do not have access to IT at home will be put in place <p>Learning in School / Curriculum</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children will have access to all of the above through IT • This will be dependent on government guidance, pupil and staff numbers <p>Vulnerable pupils</p> <p>We will strongly encourage vulnerable pupils to continue attending school. To do this, we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work with our local authority • Contact a child’s parent or carer, and (where applicable) social worker if the child does not attend, to find out why and discuss their concerns <p>Free school meals</p> <p>We will work with our suppliers to prepare meals or food parcels for all pupils eligible for free school meals, whether they are at home or on-site.</p> <p>Staffing</p>

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dependent on government advice and pupil numbers, rotas may be in place for staff <p>Safety Measures in School</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We will continue to continue to follow all the safety measures currently in place in school as per our risk assessment • Measures will be adapted according to government guidance <p>Safeguarding</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We will maintain daily contact with families to ensure we meet our safeguarding duties <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This will be done through our daily registers on Teams • The school will contact parents of those children not in attendance • Weekly calls will also be made to the families of our vulnerable children who are not attending school during lockdown or bubble closure • We will maintain regular weekly contact with staff who may be working on a rota or self-isolating • Staff will continue to follow current procedures when raising any safeguarding concerns
